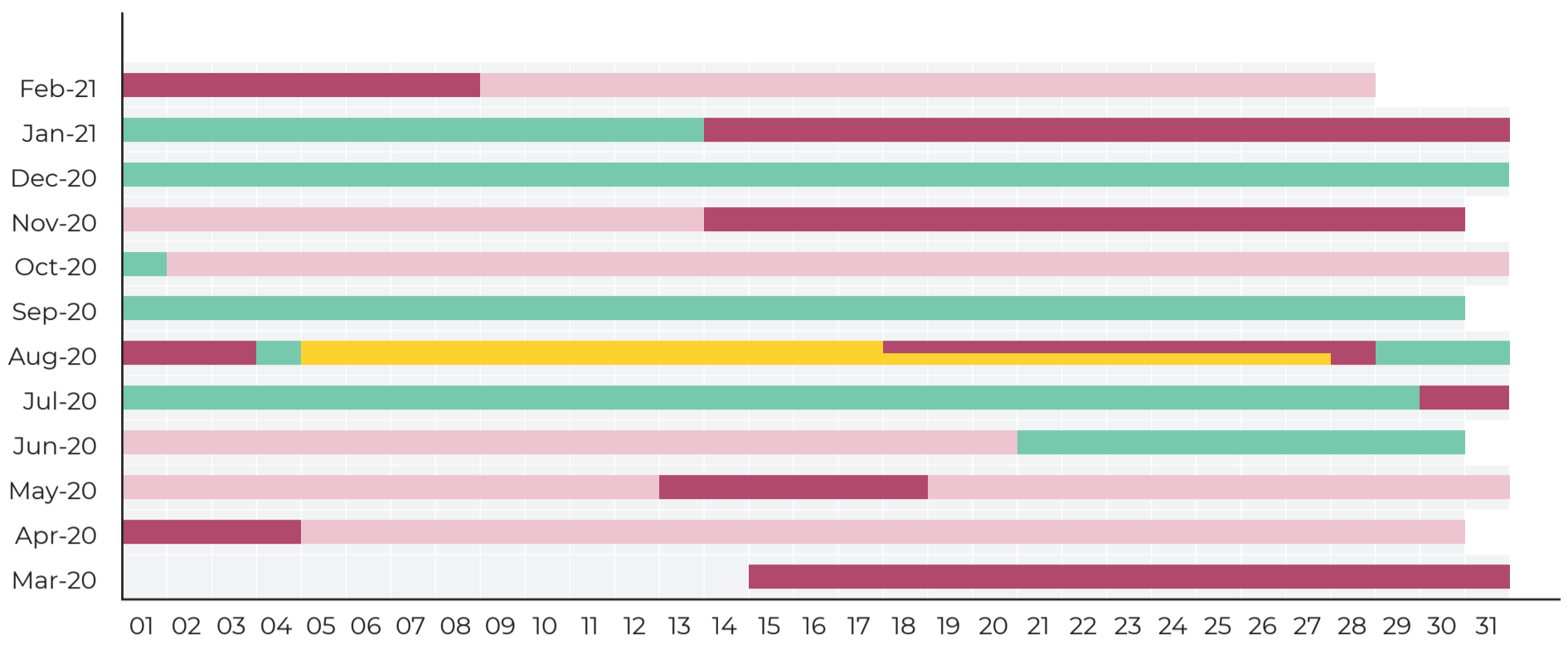


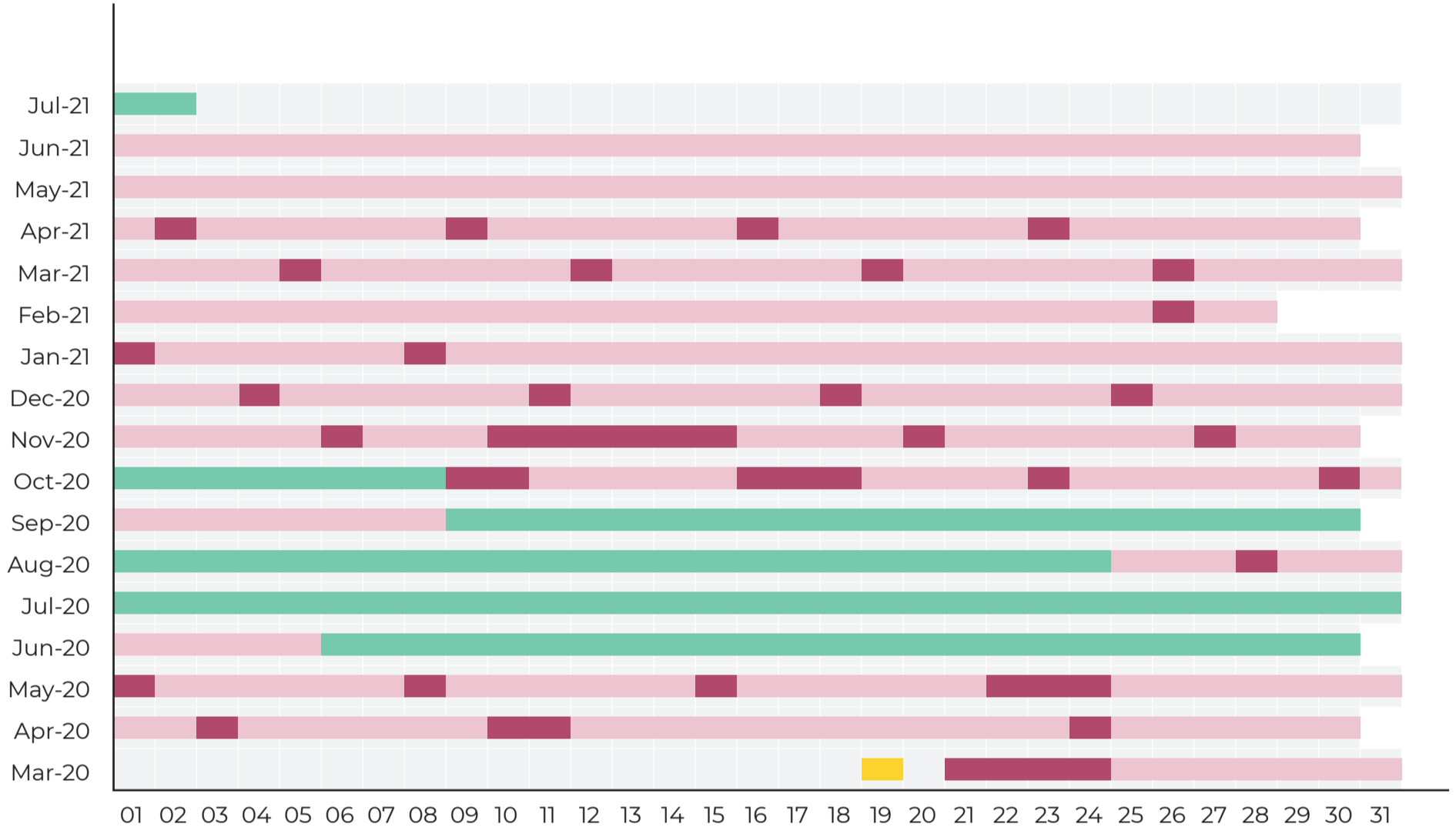
Lockdown Timeline

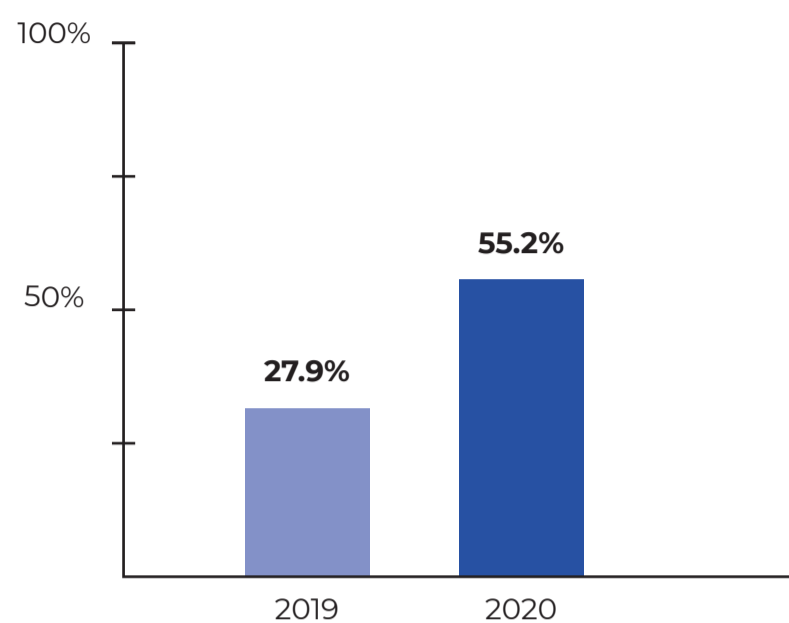

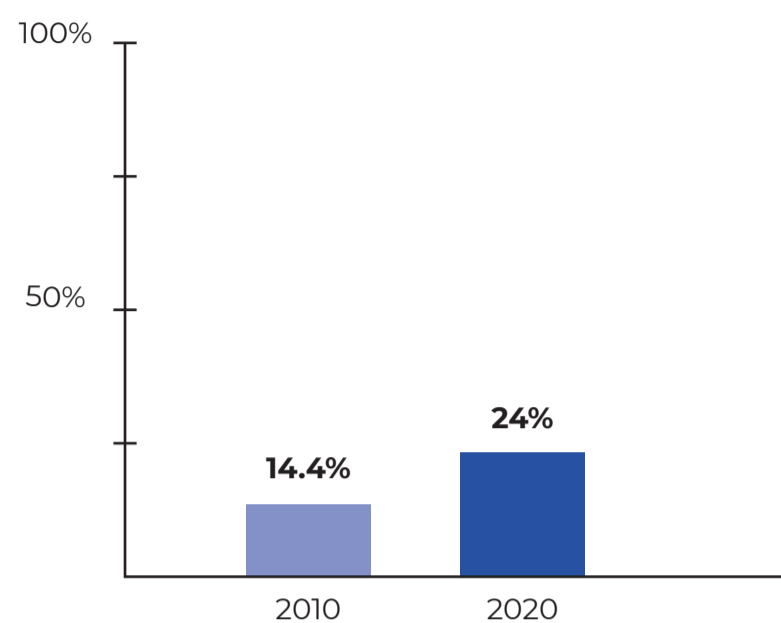


Poverty Rate

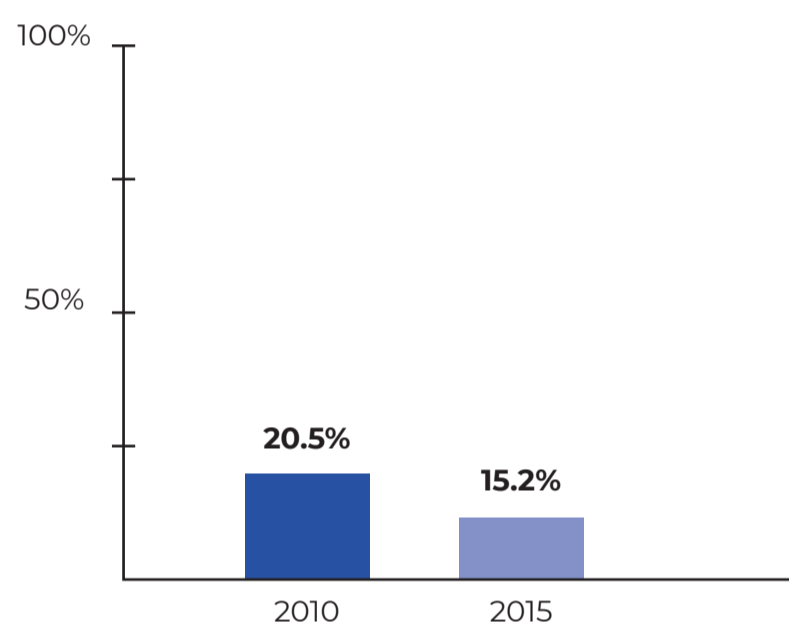

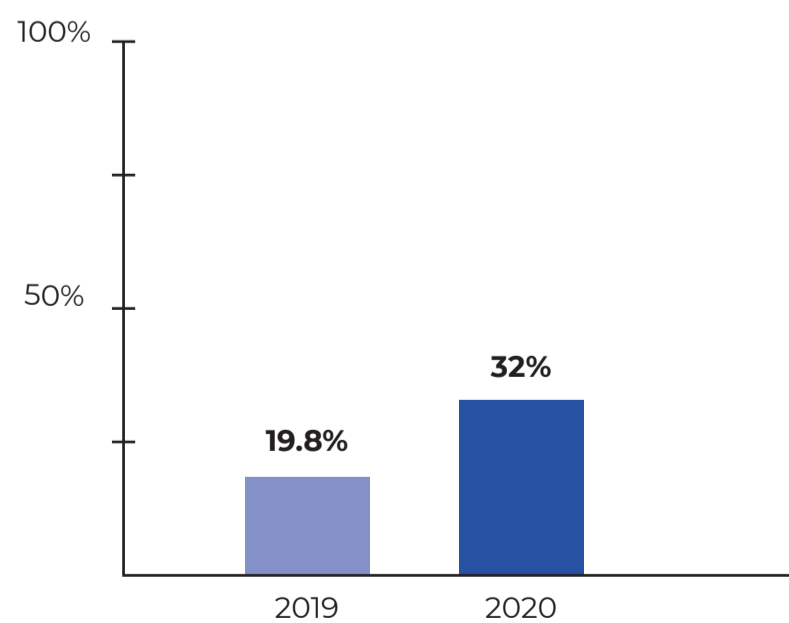

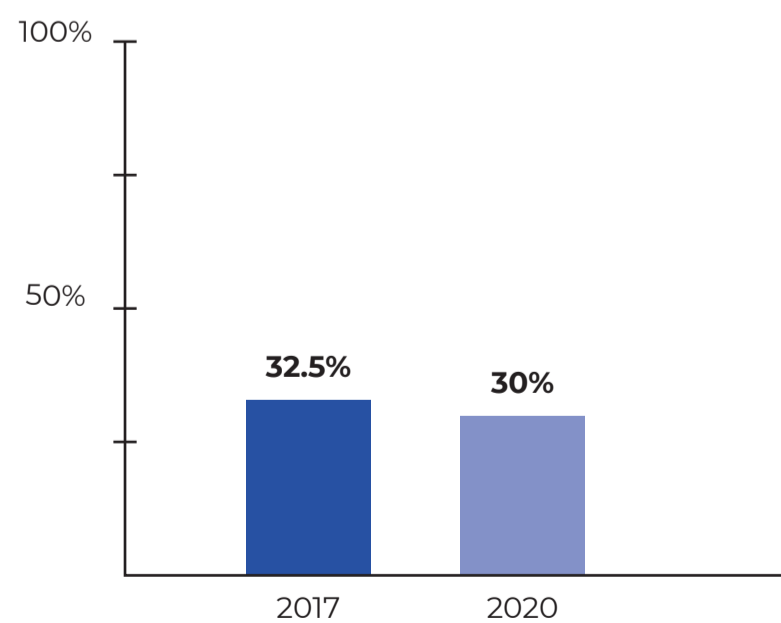


Upper Poverty Line

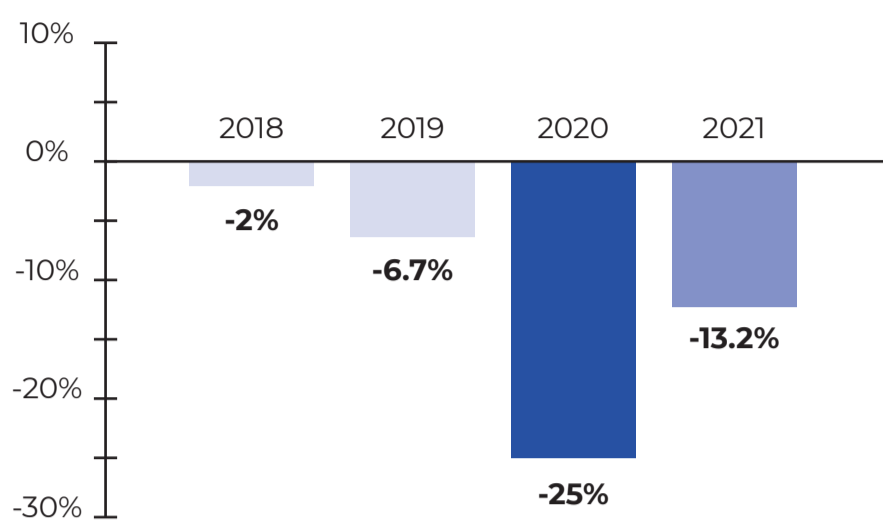

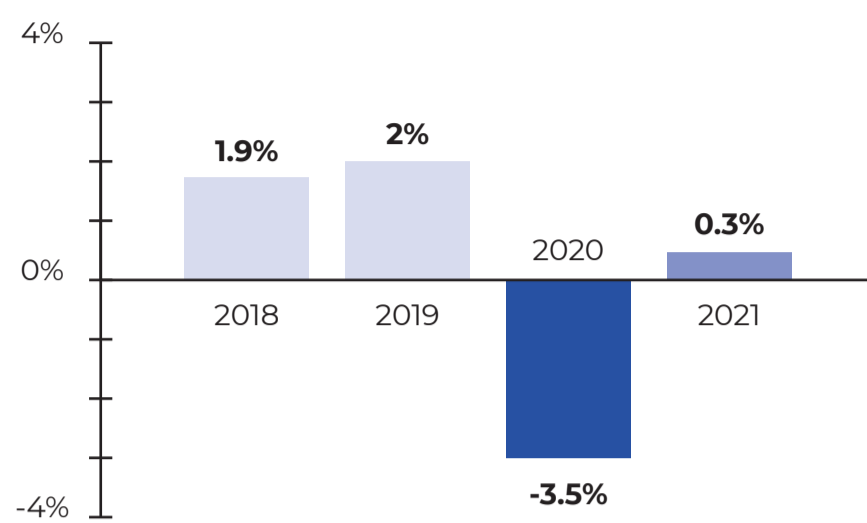

GDP Growth

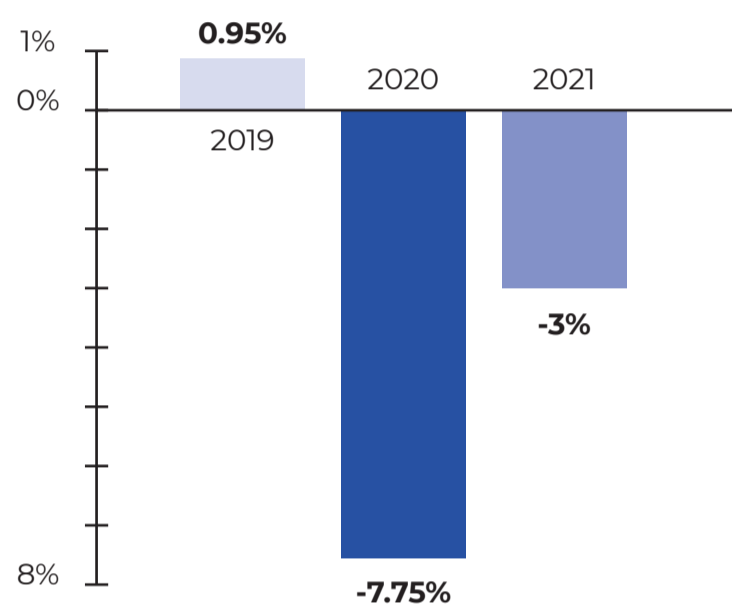

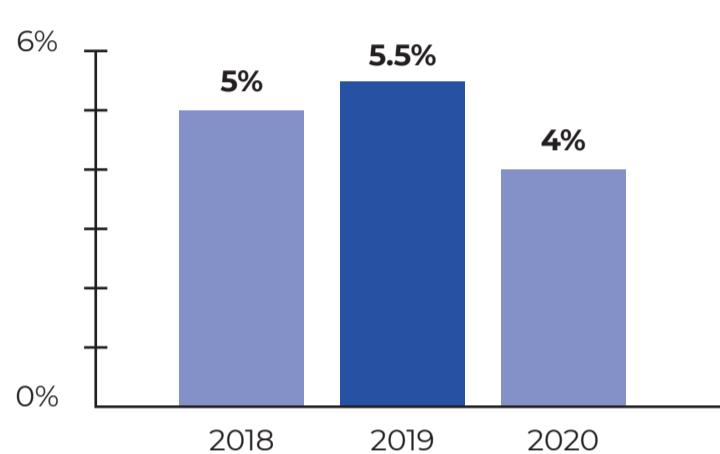

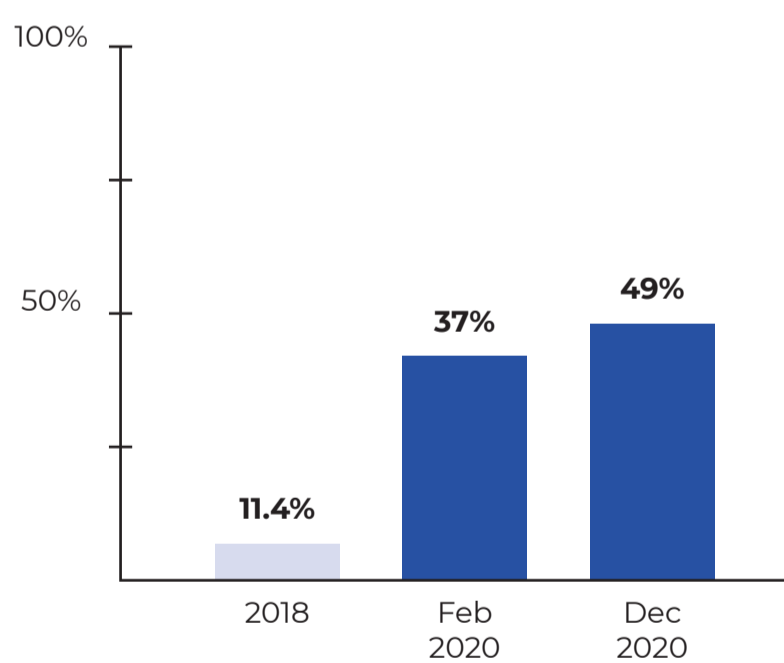

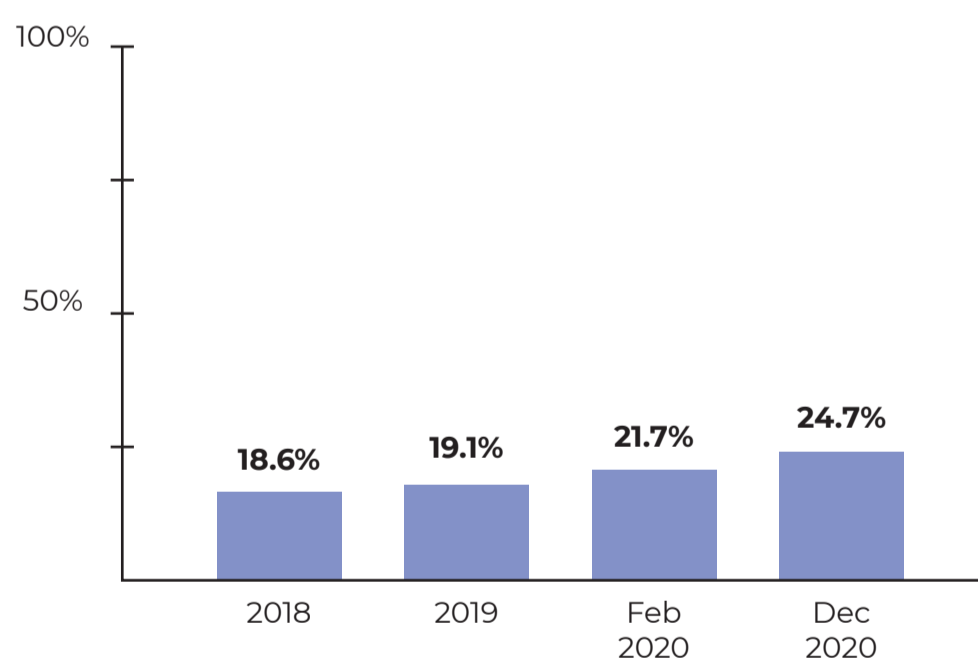


Unemployment Rate

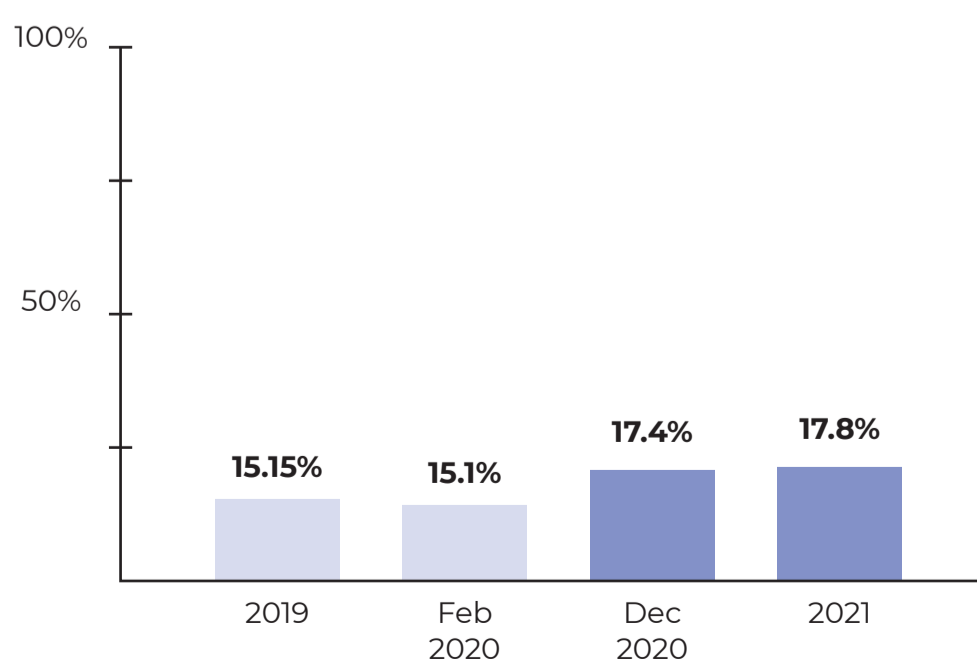

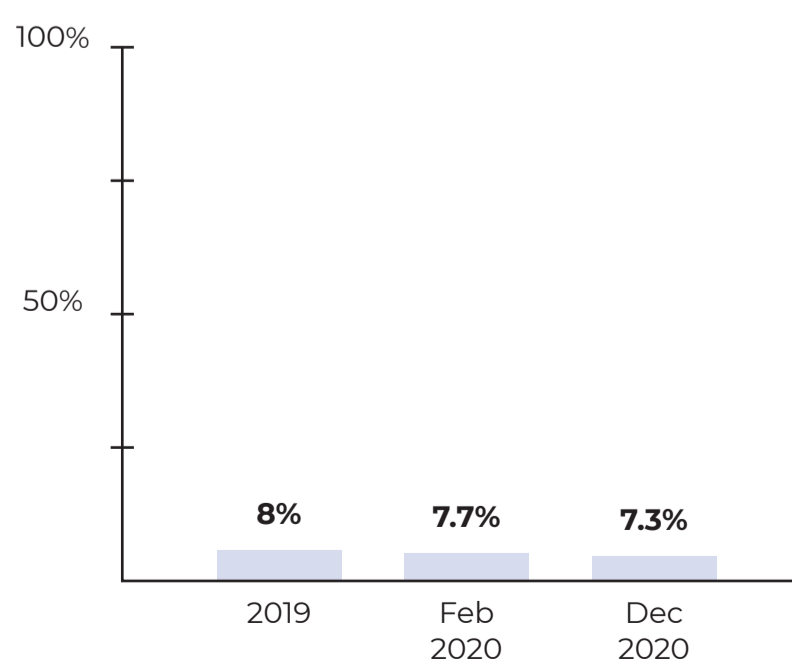

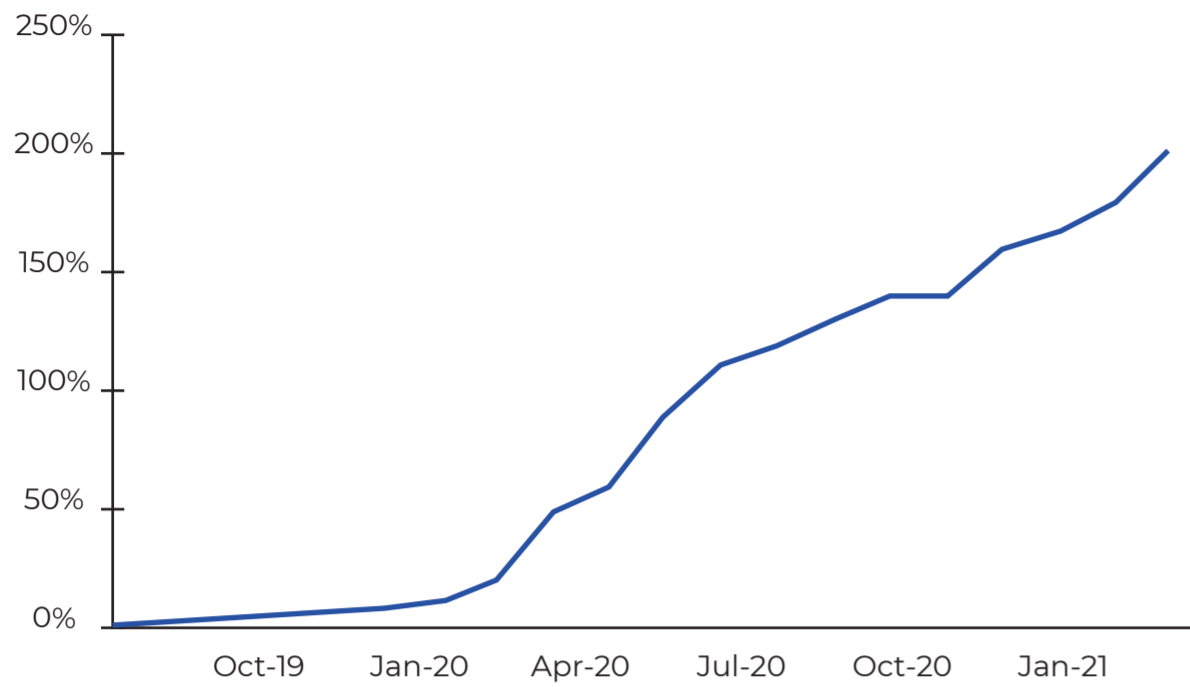

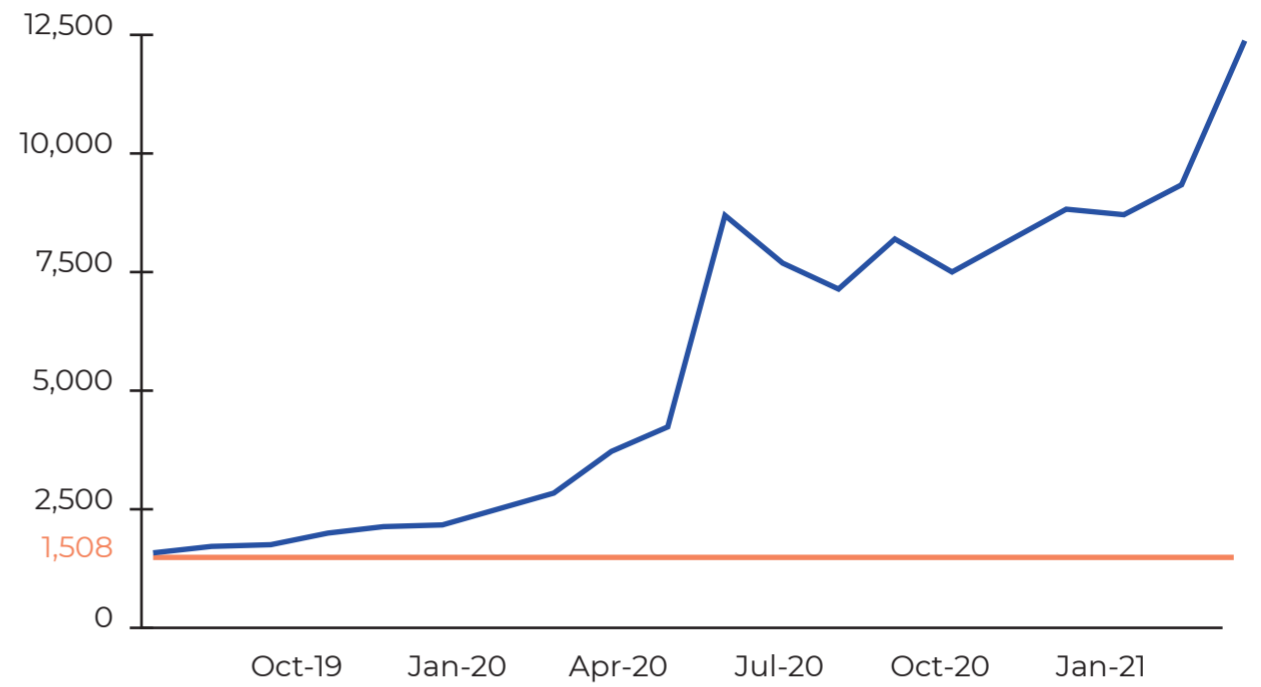


Inflation Rate and Depreciation

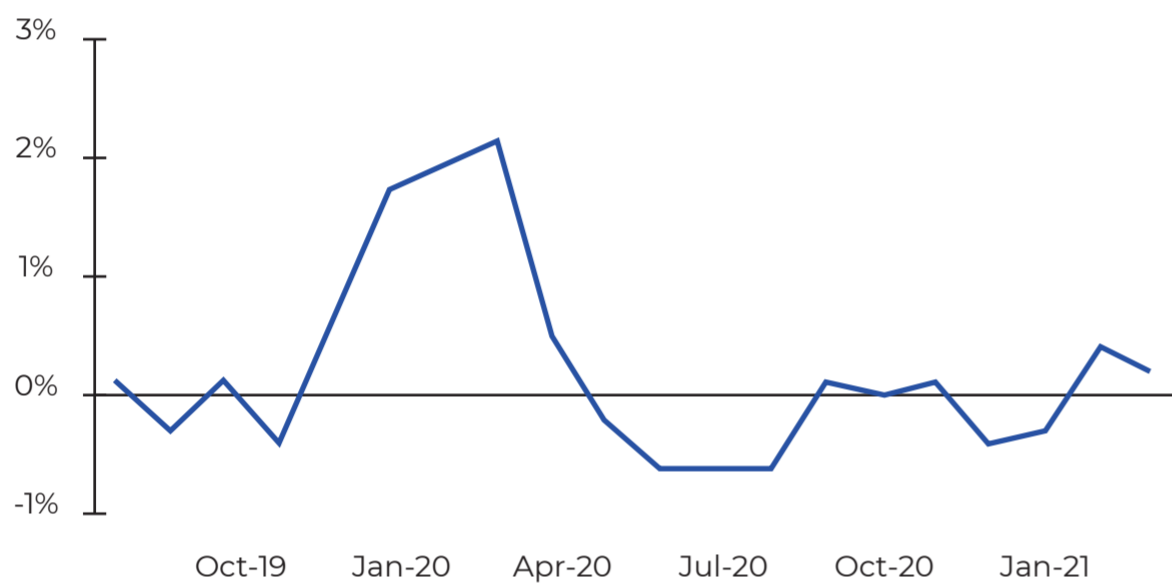

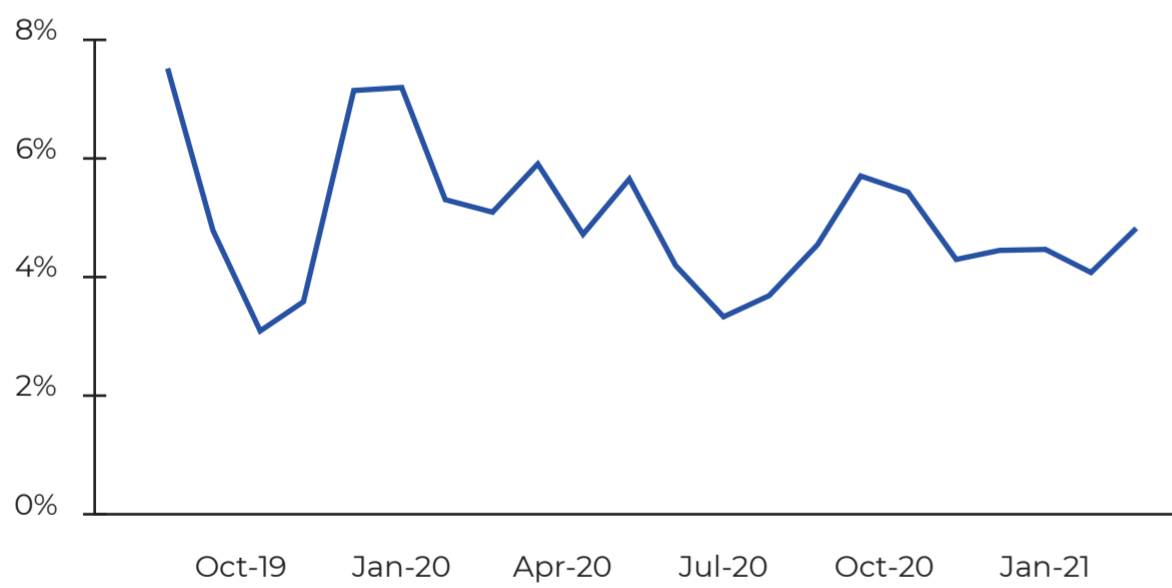

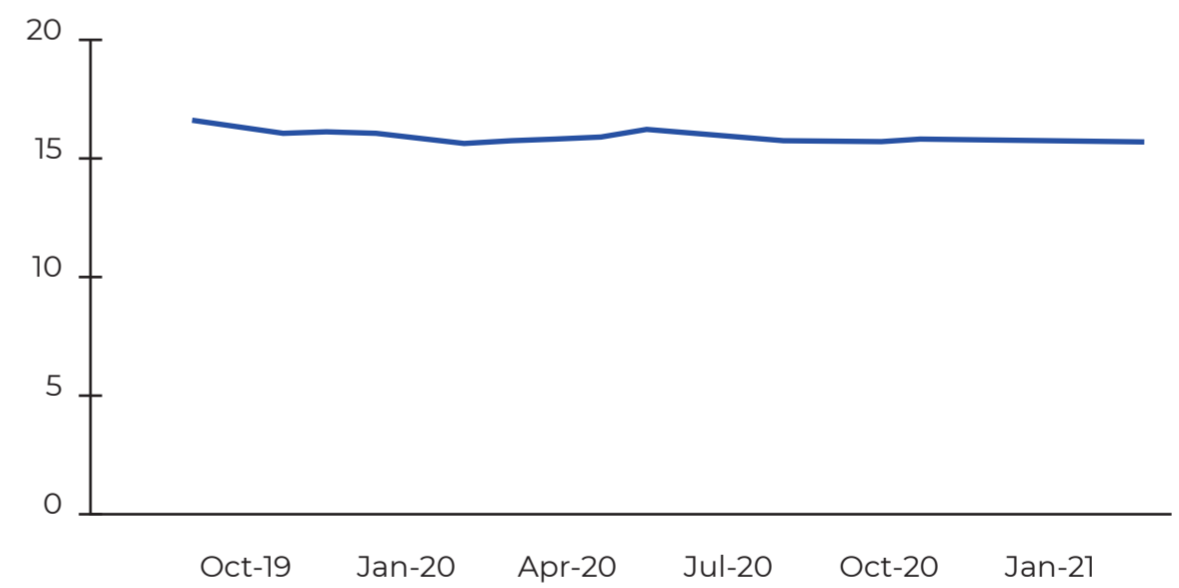

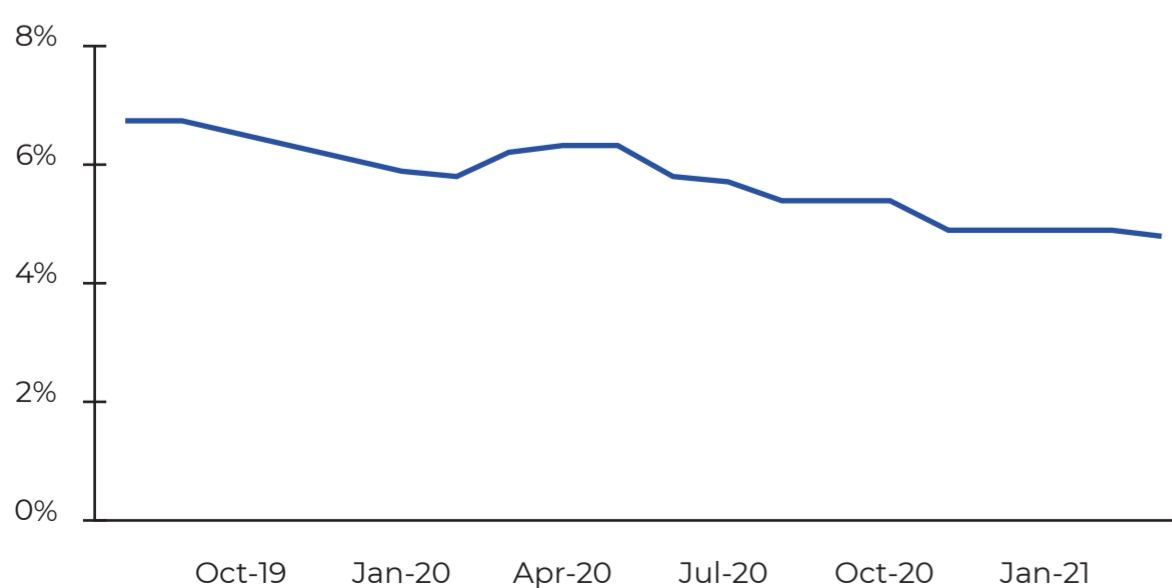

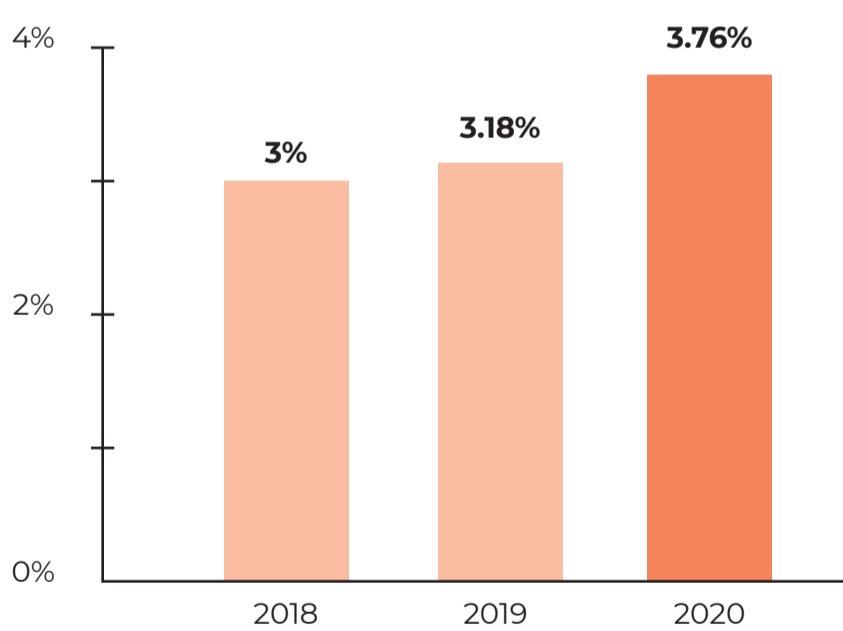

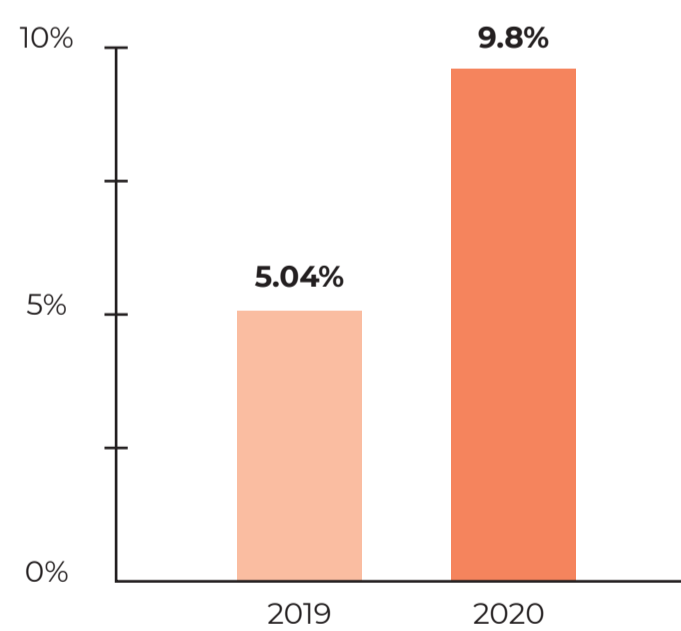

Share of Health Expenditures in State Budget

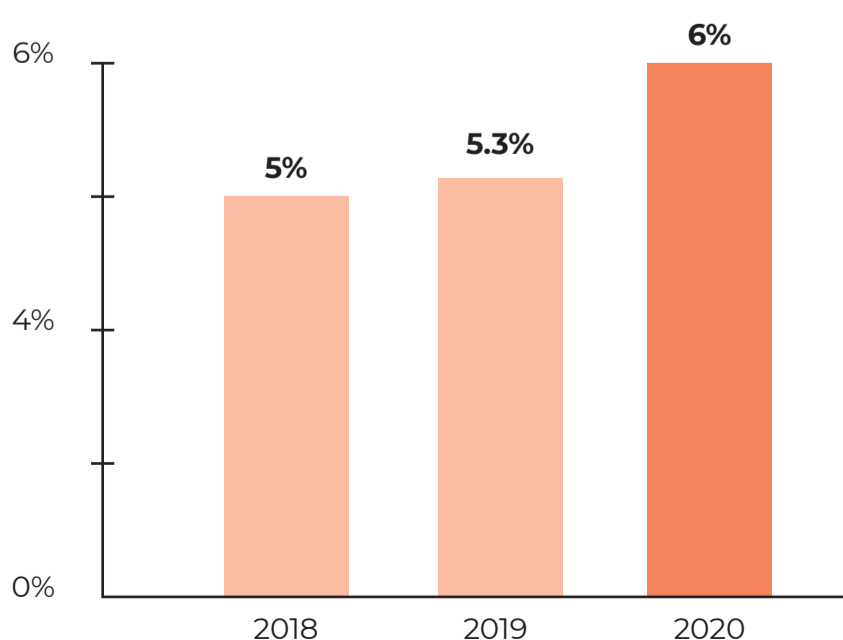
